Should the state recognise gender can a liberal state discourage traditional family structures is women's sport compatible with equality of opportunity should feminists defend women's freedom to choose cosmetic surgery is genital cutting always wrong or is it only wrong for girls freedom and equality investigates the contours of feminist liberalism a philosophical approach that is appealing but elusive its hallmark is a liberalism that prioritises equality and individual autonomy while offering a rigorous critique of using individuals' choices as the measure of justice liberalism without feminism prioritises individual choice a strategy that has played a crucial role in the liberal defence of freedom against authoritarianism and conformity however as feminism shows relying on individual choice is insufficient to render an outcome just because people often choose things that harm or disadvantage themselves from beauty norms to the gendered division of labour from marriage to religion women and men choose to arrange their lives in ways that perpetuate inequality often these choices are made in response to social norms including unjust unequal or harmful norms it follows that relying on individual choice as a measure of justice actually leaves unjust social structures intact any defender of autonomy and equality must be prepared to criticise individuals' choices while prioritising individual choosers the essays in this collection cover a wide range of issues fundamental to liberalism to feminism and to their intersection they explore the foundational philosophical concepts of choice equality of opportunity ideology and the state and they engage directly with key political controversies including women's sport the state recognition of gender the regulation of cosmetic and cultural surgeries and state action to secure equality in the family Clare Chambers argues that feminist liberalism is both possible and necessary it is possible because the two doctrines of feminism and liberalism are compatible their fundamental values of freedom and equality aligned but

feminism is necessary because liberalism has shown that it is simply not up to the task of securing gender equality and women's liberation alone

Drawing on many fields of study, including anthropology, evolutionary theory, cognitive science, linguistics, sociology, political theory, philosophy, social psychology, and law, the author explores how cultures grow and spread, how shared understandings arise, and how people of different cultures can understand and evaluate each other's views. Cultural evolution occurs through the transmission of cultural information and know-how (cultural software) in human minds. Balkin says individuals embody cultural software and spread it to others through communication and social learning. Ideology, the author contends, is neither a special nor a pathological form of thought but an ordinary product of the evolution of cultural software because cultural understanding is a patchwork of older, imperfect tools that are continually adapted to solve new problems. Human understanding is partly adequate and partly inadequate to the pursuit of justice. Balkin presents numerous examples that illuminate the sources of ideological effects and their contributions to injustice. He also enters the current debate over multiculturalism, applying his theory to problems of mutual understanding between people who hold different worldviews. He argues that cultural understanding presupposes transcendent ideals and shows how both ideological analysis of others and ideological self-criticism are possible.

As politicians and judges argue over the original intent of our country's founding fathers, the American founding itself continues to inspire a prodigious amount of research and commentary, reflecting a bewildering array of methods and interpretations. avenues of inquiry that have recently emerged scholars of the founding including louis hartz bernard bailyn gordon wood and garry wills that best exemplify different schools of interpretation gibson focuses on six approaches that have dominated the modern study of the founding progressive lockean liberal republican scottish enlightenment multicultural and multiple traditions approaches for each approach he traces its fundamental assumptions revealing deeper ideological and methodological differences between schools of thought that on the surface seem to differ only about the interpretation of historical facts while previous accounts have treated the study of the founding as the sequential replacement of one paradigm by another gibson argues that all of these interpretations survive as alternative and still viable approaches each has simultaneously illuminated and masked core truths about the american founding he renders a balanced account of the current debate over the origins and foundations of the american republic and offers solid footing on the path to understanding the vast literature devoted to this important subject

sometimes turned into public dispute she also presents new material on the controversial military attach lend lease director phillip faymonville a largely neglected officer who understood the soviet system and supported roosevelt s policy deftly combining military with diplomatic history glantz traces these philosophical and policy battles to show how difficult it was for even a highly popular president like roosevelt to overcome such entrenched and determined opposition although he reorganized federal offices and appointed ambassadors who shared his views in the end he was unable to outlast his bureaucratic opponents or change their minds with his death anti soviet factions rushed into the policymaking vacuum to become the primary architects of truman s cold war containment policy a case study in foreign relations high level policymaking and civil military relations fdr and the soviet union enlarges our understanding of the ideologies and events that set the stage for the cold war it adds a new dimension to our understanding of soviet american relations as it sheds new light on the surprising power of those in low places
